

## PROGRAMME

### Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April

Depart 9.00am Chelford for our journey to North Wales. We stop off at **Erddig Hall**. (**Entry fees to house & grounds included in the package!**) Explore a much-loved home, garden and 1,200-acre estate filled with the stories of a family and their servants. Erddig's story is all about relationships – those of the family, the servants and the wider community. It is unpretentious, unconventional and unexpected, always offering a friendly welcome. It was home to a family that took an almost curatorial attitude to their possessions. Many are recorded in verse, as are generations of servants whose portraits were commissioned by the family. With their working areas almost unchanged, Erddig is a place where servants and their lives are not forgotten. Time also for a snack or light lunch perhaps?

We arrive in **Llandudno** early afternoon to the **Tynedale Hotel** for check in and a most welcome complimentary cup of tea and cake. After unpacking you will have time to perhaps stroll along the promenade, visit the shops or just relax in the hotel bar or lounge. Don't forget the "Happy Hour"! After Dinner we have our first evening of entertainment.

**Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> April**

Today after a fabulous Tynedale breakfast (why not try the porridge with whisky, cream and brown sugar!) we depart to **Glassblobbery** where we have arranged our own special demonstrations for our group! A demonstration of flame glass blowing, a demonstration of glass blobbing/flame working and a demonstration of a 17th century Venetian technique of glass lace work. (Price of demonstration included in break)

In between the demonstrations there is information about the glass and history of Glassblobbery. We have time to look around the shop and purchase a coffee in the Diner next door!

We continue to **Llangollen** where you have free time for lunch and a look around and then we have organised our group to take part in a **horse drawn boat trip on the Llangollen Canal**. The boats are wheelchair accessible! (Boat trip included in package!)

We then return to Tynedale. Entertainment follows Dinner in the hotel.

**Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> April**

Morning at Leisure. Time to explore **Llandudno** or sit and relax.



At 1pm we leave for a trip to the **National Slate Museum, Llanberis** (admission included)

Dinorwig Quarry closed in 1969. Today, rather than fashioning wagons and forging rails, the workshops tell a very special story: the story of the Welsh slate industry. The National Slate Museum is sited in the Victorian workshops built in the shadow of Elidir mountain, site of the vast Dinorwig quarry. Here you can travel into the past of an industry and a way of life that has chiselled itself into the very being of this country. The Workshops and Buildings are designed as though quarrymen and engineers have just put down their tools and left the courtyard for home, while an array of Talks and Demonstrations including slate-splitting give you a real insight into quarry life. The Ffowntan café serves a variety of refreshments from sandwiches and home-made soup to cakes, treats and hot meals. Gift shop. We return to the Tynedale for drinks before Dinner and another night of entertainment

**Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> April**

After breakfast we depart for a scenic drive stopping at a **pottery**. Chance to see how the pots are made, look around and have a cup of tea or coffee (**refreshments included in package**)

We head to **Caernarvon** where you have time to look around the town, perhaps visit the castle or harbour or browse the many independent shops, or just sit and people watch!

We then travel through though magnificent scenery through **Llanberis** and **Capel Curig** to **Betws y Coed** where we have arranged **full afternoon tea at the Royal Oak Hotel** (**included in package**) We then make our way back to the Tynedale for our last Dinner and night of entertainment.

### **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> April**

After breakfast our luggage is loaded onto the coach. A final chance to look around Llandudno, last minute shopping and lunch before departure. At 2pm we then board the coach for our journey home stopping off for Scones with Jam & Cream and pots of tea at a delightful 4 star hotel (**included in package**) We arrive in Chelford around 6pm.
